MARA News Minutes: Motion made to approve the Minutes as published in MARA News from June 2012. Motion was seconded and approved.

Treasurers Report: Motion made to approve the Treasury Report as drafted by Phil – N1XTB and read by Barry-N1EZH. Motion was seconded and approved.

Repeater Report: Our Repeater appears to be operating normally. Jeff – N1ZZN reported at our May meeting that there has been some malicious interference on the Whitman Repeater, then the MARA Repeater. Jeff – N1ZZN will send shutdown/reset codes to certain Club Members to discourage such behavior on our Repeaters.

Road Races, Miscellaneous Reports: Carl – N1FY:

Carl – N1FY went to the ARRL Headquarters to give a Skywarn Training presentation and brought back some Radio Communications Vests that were made available to those at our meeting who would like one. Thank you Carl – N1FY.

Bridgewater EOC operations: The plan was to put up new antennas, however the town is in the process of Renovating the Academy Building within the coming year and everything will have to be moved out to a Temporary (Possibly Permanent) location on Rte 28 at the old McElwin Elementary School. It will take 1-1/2 – 2 Years for completion once work begins. Carl – N1FY says he plans to put up an Antenna for our MEMA

Transceiver in the interim. At some point other Antennas and an HF Antenna will need to be installed once we know the time frame of the renovation project. Carl- N1FY confirmed that our Bridgewater EOC will have to be moved permanently when the time comes.

Logbook of the World Now Supports CQ's WPX Award

The wait is over! After weeks of beta testing, the ARRL launched the integration of Logbook of The World (LoTW) -- its electronic confirmation system -- with CQ Magazine's Worked All Prefixes (WPX) Award on Monday, July 2. The WPX Award is the first of the CQ-sponsored awards that LoTW will support. More than 51,000 radio amateurs worldwide use Logbook of The World, and there are currently almost 432 million QSOs in the LoTW system

California Ham Cited \$17,000 for Operating Unlicensed Radio Station

On July 2, the FCC issued a *Notice of Apparent Liability for Forfeiture and Order* in the amount of \$17,000, accusing Brian R. Ragan, KF6EGI, of Suisun City, California, of "apparently willfully and repeatedly violating" the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, by operating an unlicensed radio transmitter on frequency 104.9 MHz and failing to allow an inspection of his station by FCC personnel. The Commission said that Ragan, "as a licensed Amateur Radio operator for at least six years, [he] should be aware that any radio equipment at his station must be made available for inspection at any time when requested by the FCC, and also should be aware of the proper operation of his amateur station in accordance with the Rules."

The Massasoit Amateur Radio Association volunteered to provide communication support for the Middleboro YMCA Triathlon held on Saturday, July 8, 2012. **Carl Aveni N1FY** had put out an open invitation for area HAMs to participate. Members of both the Massasoit Club and the Whitman Amateur Radio Club responded. The weather was clear, sunny and hot with the temperature around 83 degrees by the end of the Triathlon.

The Triathlon involved a 1 mile swim in Lake Tispaquin, a 24 mile bike race (four loops around the race course), and a 6 mile run. There were 235 participants with some teams splitting up the swimming, biking and running. The Triathlon started in waves with the elite participants entering the water at about 8:10 a.m. and the lead runner finishing at about 10:20 a.m. in a little over 2 hours. The slower but determined participants took between 4 and 5 hours to finish.

Carl N1FY set up Net Control Base Station at the start / finish line at Camp Yomechas. The rest of the Radio Team volunteers were positioned at the lake and at various intersections around the race course. Communication was by 2-Meter 146.535 MHz simplex. **Carl N1FY** provided reflective vests that has "Radio Communication" printed on them, to all the Radio Team volunteers.

Bill Burke NR1FD also volunteered to participate and asked Carl N1FY if he wanted him on the race course or at the Middleboro Emergency Operations Center (EOC) where he is a Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES) radio operator. Carl N1FY agreed that the Middleboro EOC, where Bill NR1FD could monitor Net Control on their amateur radio equipment, would be the best location. There was one incident where it was reported that a participant had something in her eye and the First Aid Team at the Medical Tent said it was beyond their scope and they required additional medical evaluation. The unique thing was - Carl N1FY was able to call Bill NR1FD at the Middleboro EOC via amateur radio and Bill NR1FD dispatched an ambulance to the camp. The participants was treated at the scene and released. The Radio Team was also monitoring the progress of other participants, like one who hit a pothole and fell off her bike, but was OK. The safety and support of the participants and staff are always our primary concern.
